SOLAR SYSTEM

52.8kW SOLAR SYSTEM

We are very excited to announce to the school community that we will be commencing the installation of 120 Trina Solar panels and 1 Fronius Converter during the upcoming school holidays. As per the picture below, they are to be installed on the top of the new gym roof at a pitch designed to maximise the north-facing sunlight.

Total Solar & Electrical were the successful installers and chosen after two years of research and planning by school council to be the best fit for our school. We were also keen to keep our business local for a number of reasons, not least that we have almost immediate backup from them as they are based in Grovedale.

Weather permitting, installation will begin at 7am on Monday 23rd and hopefully will be completed for our return to school. If using the school grounds over the break, please be mindful of trucks and workers being onsite!!

As you can see from the graphs & pictures below, part of our analysis was trying to maximise the potential of a big roof space while making sure that we had minimal impact on our buildings and playgrounds. The only visible structure from ground level will be the inverter which will be housed in a locked cage on the southern part of the building.

Being a school that prides itself on environmental awareness, we are extremely pleased that we will not only save the school \$\$ across many years to our ever-increasing power bills, but importantly, having a positive impact on the environment by reducing our carbon footprint.

ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS


Your solar system will generate significant environmental benefits. These come primarily from avoided power plant emissions.



5 TIPS TO GET YOUR CHILD

OFF THEIR EMOTIONAL ROLLERCOASTER:



Use **empathy** to show their emotional outbursts don't make you love them any less.

"I can see that you're struggling right now, and I'm here for you. I love you."



HELP THEM UNDERSTAND HOW THEY ARE FEELING

Avoid **telling** them how they should feel about a situation. Instead, help them understand how they are feeling.

"I can see that your body is tense and you're breathing fast. It looks like you're feeling angry and frustrated."

BRAINSTORM IDEAS FOR DEALING WITH BIG EMOTIONS TOGETHER

Remind them of these ideas when they need them.

"Next time you feel this way, what would help? What could you tell yourself to help ride it out?"

TALK TO YOUR CHILD

Wait until they are in a more **emotionally stable place**. Then, talk about their behaviors and what they need to do differently.

"Remember when you were very angry yesterday? Let's talk about how I can help you next time you're feeling that way."

TEACH YOUR CHILD A "BIG EMOTIONS MANTRA":

Life is full of ups and downs, but they are all part of the journey! My emotions are like big waves, and I can ride them out! Emotions change, but love stays the same!

By actively helping your child learn to recognize, understand, and cope with emotional highs and lows, you'll prepare them for the roller coaster of life.


